Fall is once more upon us and the temperature may be dropping but the work load on the Island does not seem to be. Local 276 is still at around 95% employment and has no sign of things slowing down any time soon. With some large projects on the horizon, as well as commercial construction being at an all time high, it looks like we will be riding this wave for a while to come. Projects such as, the Federal Government just releasing the go ahead of a 7 Billiondollar, 20-year maintenance contract for twelve of its Halifax frigate's to be divided up between three companies in Canada, SeaSpan being one of them. The Provincial Government is working hard with Vancouver Island Building Trades, Seaspan and BC Ferries to have more of the new ferry construction done locally, this should further simulate many of our Vancouver Island Contractors therefore creating more jobs for our members.

While most of Western Canada is still in a down turn, the rest of BC looks to be running strong. The announcement of the 40 billion-dollar LNG project, the largest project in BC's history, looks to be 5 years of industrial work for the construction industry in BC.

Having a labour friendly Government that is out there supporting such things as living wage, benefits, local hire, apprenticeships and work place diversity is a strong benefit when we have these opportunities on large local infrastructure projects. There has been a lot of opposition and propaganda against the NDP from the Liberals and contractor controlled "so called" unions such as ICBA, CLAC and MERRITT who would love to see this work given to the lowest bidder, which puts all the profit in the hands of rich and takes it away from the working class.

If you feel politics really doesn't affect you, trust me they do! Through most of all the United States and even most provinces in Canada, organized labour is under attack! Well-funded anti-union groups are doing all they can to stack local government with people who have big business as their highest concern while trying to convince the public that they have their best interest at heart.

HEALTH INFORMATION



As most of you have heard, the government has made changes to MSP premiums that we pay here in BC. They are to be phased out by year 2020 and replaced with a payroll tax to be absorbed by our contractors. After a lot of discussion, the executive board has decided to reallocate \$0.30 from the health and welfare to be moved into the pension, \$0.10 a year for three years.

A reminder that health spending receipts for 2018 have to be summitted to the office by the end of January 2019 for reimbursement.

The boot allowance attached to the heath spending account has been greatly received. We have seen many of the members take advantage of this benefit that will hopefully help in foot, back and leg fatigue from the practice of wearing worn out boots.

PENSION INFORMATION

As stated in the health information the local has reallocated \$0.10 toward pension as of right now and another \$0.20 over the next two years. Due to the health of the Plan, the pension trustees have found that a 10 %, across the board past service benefit is accessible at this time starting as of Nov 31, 2018.
